Children of Sathe Nagar, had to walk across a 100 feet long stretch of an open and dirty canal, which has also claimed a few lives. The parents were reluctant to send their children to school.



Witnessing this, Eshan Balbale felt the immediate need for a bridge over the canal.

But building a concrete bridge would take a long time and he would need permission from the government.



Eshan decided to make a bamboo bridge which would be light yet strong, and could provide basic safety to the kids as they travel every day.
