

Subject and Predicate

A sentence broadly consists of two components i.e A Subject and Predicate.

Subject

That part of a sentence which names the person or thing we are talking about is known as a subject.

Predicate

That part of the sentence which tells something about the subject is known as the predicate.

Akbar was a great emperor.

In the example given above Akbar is the subject of the sentence and was a great emperor is its predicate.

Note:-The subject of the sentence usually comes first but certain time it can be put after the Predicate.

Solved questions:

1. Harish reads the book.

Subject – Harish

Predicate – reads the book.

2. The veterinarian examined all the tigers.

Subject – The veterinarian

Predicate – examined all the tigers.

3. Sit down

Subject -you

predicate-sit down

4. The girl with the long black hair lives in front of my house.

Subject- The girl with the long black hair

Predicate - lives in front of my house.

5. Stand on your head

Subject- you

Predicate- stand on your head

6. She is my best friend

Subject – she

Predicate- is my best friend

7. You don't have to wait for me.

Subject- you

Predicate-don't have to wait for me.

8. A rich merchant was passing by the shoemaker's window.

Subject- A rich merchant

Predicate- was passing by the shoemaker's window

9. My younger brother serves in the army.

Subject- My younger brother

Predicate- serves in the army

10. The cat is sleeping in the Sun.

Subject- The cat

Predicate- is sleeping in the Sun
