

Sentences

A group of words that makes complete sense is called a sentence. A sentence always begins with a capital letter and ends with a full-stop, a question mark or an exclamation mark. A sentence must contain a subject and a verb.

kinds of sentences:

sentences are of four kinds.

- 1) **Declarative or assertive sentences:** These sentences state or declare something and they end with a full stop (.)

Declarative sentences are of two types

- A) Affirmative (Positive)
- B) Negative

- 2) **Interrogative sentences:** These sentences ask questions and end with (?)

- 3) **Imperative sentences:** These sentences give orders, commands or advice or requests.

- 4) **Exclamatory sentences:** These sentences express strong or sudden feelings or emotions.
